Robin Housemonger (Author) Robin was born in Worcester Park, Surrey, into a family "unremarkable in every way except for an aunt with red hair who used to sing all the high twiddly bits from The Merry Widow over the tea-table." She began writing "to fill the long hours between one woolen hosiery order and the next," and turned that experience into her first play, Socks Before Marriage, which ran in the West End for nine years. Two later plays, Briefs Encounter and Hanky Panky, broke box office records in Perth.

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
